Course Fee - Eligibility

Your training is subsidised by the NSW Government. It is funded under the Smart and Skilled-Targeted Skills Program (Skills for Recovery).

To be eligible for the Smart and Skilled - Skills for Recovery, you need to be one of the following:

1. A person aged 16 to 24 at commencement of training, regardless of employment status, including Year 12 school leavers.
2. Veteran
3. Veteran's Recognised Partner
4. A person who is a recipient of a Commonwealth Government welfare benefit (and their dependants)
5. An unemployed person
6. An employed person who is 'expected to become unemployed'
